Available Position: Assistant/Associate/Professor of Pathology

The Alabama College of Osteopathic Medicine (ACOM) is now recruiting for a full-time Assistant/Associate/Professor of Pathology. The position includes work in the classroom and in out-of-classroom settings to develop and disseminate technical/scientific knowledge to ACOM students. Faculty in the Department of Pathology are central to the development and integration of pre-clinical curricula in team-based and large- and small-group learning environments.

Duties and Responsibilities:

- Participate in the mentoring, advising, and supervising of medical, graduate, or other health professional students;
- Evaluate student progress in learning appropriate medical knowledge and communicate these evaluations to the student and administration/faculty members as appropriate;
- Serve in leadership and membership capacities on college and faculty committees;
- Evaluate, develop, and deliver course materials as assigned by supervisor to assure delivery of a quality curriculum;
- Teach and/or participate in lab exercises or small group training sessions as time allows and as assigned by supervisor;
- Actively pursue scientific research or other scholarly activity in one or more areas of study;
- Participate in professional and scientific meetings to further individual knowledge and to contribute to the development of other professionals;
- Prepare and deliver presentations to other professionals at ACOM and during local, regional, and national professional and scientific meetings;
- Course coordination or other duties as assigned by the Dean;
- Promote the mission of ACOM to all faculty, staff, students, and the community at large;
- Promote effective working relationships among faculty, staff, and students

Required Qualifications:

- MD or DO
- Board certification by appropriate specialty board
- Demonstrated experience in teaching or postdoctoral training
- Excellent interpersonal, verbal, and communication skills
- Demonstrated ability to complete multiple tasks/assignments and meet deadlines
- Demonstrated ability to exercise good judgment and leadership skills
- Excellent organizational skills and detail oriented

Preferred Qualifications:

- Eligible for licensure in Alabama
- Previous academic experience in an osteopathic institution or other medical college
- Demonstrated experience working in an integrated curriculum or with graduate program administration
