Assistant/Associate Professor of Anatomy

This is a new full-time position to add to our existing faculty to teach first- and second-year medical students. The faculty member is expected to contribute to the development of scholarly programs in areas of their choosing

Required Qualifications:

- PhD or equivalent in Human Anatomy or other related field

Preferred Qualifications:

- Prior teaching experience in a medical or biomedical program.
- Preference will be given to applicants who can teach in a cadaver-based, clinically-orientated Gross Anatomy and/or Neuroanatomy courses (lectures and labs).

The review of applications will begin immediately and continue until the position is filled. Salary will be commensurate with experience and qualifications, and includes an excellent benefits package.
