Assistant/Associate Professor of Emergency Medicine

The Alabama College of Osteopathic Medicine (ACOM) is now recruiting for a full-time Assistant/Associate Professor of Emergency Medicine. The position includes teaching Osteopathic medical students throughout our innovative, interdisciplinary, four-year curriculum. Clinical faculty teach first- and second-year students in the classroom (including team teaching with Basic Science faculty) and in clinical skills labs. Course leadership is expected. Clinical faculty may also oversee clinical clerkship curriculum for the third- and fourth-year students. One day per week of clinical practice is encouraged as well.

Required Qualifications:

- D.O./M.D. degree
- Board certification by the appropriate AOA or ACGME specialty board
- Eligibility for licensure in Alabama

Preferred Qualifications:

- Minimum of five years' experience in clinical medicine, as well as residency/academic medicine teaching and leadership.
